Go Fish!

Cindy Mccoy's **Go Fish! Kennel Quilt** is designed to fit perfectly into a small cat kennel. This little quilt is easily made from your stash in no time at all, and is sure to make you smile!

Materials:

Use pre-washed, 100% cotton fabrics and batting.

24 (twenty-four) 3-1/2" squares in various blue fabrics for background

8-1/2" x 11" piece of yellow/orange fabric for fish


1" x 1" piece of black fabric for fish eye


12-1/2" x 18-1/2" rectangle of fabric for backing

12-1/2" x 18-1/2" rectangle of batting

8-1/2" x 11" piece of freezer paper

Skill Level





Directions:

Sew pieces right sides together using a 1/4" seam and a small stitch length (e.g. 14 stitches/inch).

- 1. Lay out the 24 blue squares in 4 rows of 6 squares each, as shown in the layout and quilting diagram. Sew each row of 6 squares together. Press the seams in alternating directions for each row. Sew the rows together to complete the pieced background. Press the seams in one direction.
- 2. Print the *Go Fish!* templates found on the third page. Trace the fish and fish eye onto freezer paper. Cut out each shape 1/4" beyond the line.
- 3. Iron the freezer paper templates to the right side of the appropriate fabric pieces. Cut the pieces out on the line.
- 4. Remove the freezer paper from the fabric pieces.
- 5. Center the fish on the pieced background and pin in place. Referring to the layout, pin the fish eye in place.

- 6. Secure the pieces to the background using a small hem or satin stitch that overlaps the raw edges of the appliqué.
- 7. Place the quilt backing right side up on a flat surface. With right sides together, align the raw edges of the quilt top and the quilt backing. Place the batting on top of the quilt top, again aligning the raw edges. Pin in place.
- 8. Sew the top and backing together leaving a 10" opening for turning. Make sure to catch the batting when stitching. Backstitch on either side of the opening. Trim corners.
- 9. Turn the quilt right side out. Carefully poke out the corners. Whipstitch the opening closed with small, tight stitches. Press.
- 10. Quilt in a simple pattern to keep the batting in place. See diagram above.

Guidelines for Small Kennel Quilts:

- ► Materials used should be 100% cotton (biodegradable).
- ► Pre-wash fabrics (pets can have allergies just like humans).
- ► Finished size should be 12" x 18". This fits the most commonly used small kennel used at shelters.
- ▶ When piecing, use a small stitch length (e.g. 14 stitches/inch).
- ▶ Do not use binding as it can be hazardous to pets if it becomes loose. Layer, sew around the edge using a small stitch length, and turn quilts pillow-cover style. Whipstitch the opening with small, tight stitches.
- ► Use only simple appliqués that are secured with tight stitches along the edges. Avoid using fusibles.
- Keep the quilting simple and use small tight quilting stitches that won't catch on pet claws. Do not tie quilts as the ends can get caught in claws or chewed off.
- ▶ Do not use any metallic threads or other embellishments (e.g. beads, charms, buttons, ribbons, lace, trims, etc.) of any kind. Do not add handles or loops to the guilt.
